I hope this note finds you well. This past Sunday was a day of celebration here at church as Jeanne Toepfer celebrated her 100'th Birthday. I can't imagine everything here eyes have seen or her ears have heard. The scope of a life that long boggles my mind.

I have spent a fair amount of time this week in conversation with other clergy, as I've had to take some classes to keep my credentialing current. Our discussions, during breaks, inevitably turned to the events in Minneapolis. Do you know that on this past Tuesday, ICE was shooting tear gas into pre-schools where children of immigrants might be. They targeted children. I explore my values as a Christian, and listen to the words of Jesus as he implores us to care for widows and orphans, the least among us, the sojourners in our midst, to take care of children, to feed the hungry, the give drink to the thirsty, to care for the sick, to visit the imprisoned, to clothe the naked. These are my core values, and they are under assault. No wonder I have trouble sleeping. Perhaps you do, too.


# ANCIENT SCHOOLS OF THOUGHT SERIES
