My heart is breaking this morning over the events that took place in Minnesota yesterday. Not only was an American citizen gunned down and murdered by ICE agents, and not only was a child left without a mother, and not only was a woman now left without her partner, and not only is an entire city – perhaps state, even -- in turmoil, but what really breaks my heart is that so much of the country is silent this day, and so many congregations would prefer that their pastors just don't talk about such things. These things crush our very souls, suck away our hope, and make us wonder why we should even get out of bed in the morning. I wonder, what Jesus would say and do? First, like he did with Lazarus, I think he would see the city of Minneapolis grieving and he would pull up a piece of curb, sit down, put his head in his hands, and weep (not just a little tear coming out of his eye, but uncontrollable, shoulders heaving, barely able to catch your breath wailing). The second thing I think Jesus would do is call the people around him into action – *Actions based in love, countering the actions of violence that were done out of a place of deep darkness.*

We have just completed the season of Christmas, celebrating the coming of The Light into the world. The season of Epiphany is now upon us, the season in which we celebrate how that light is revealed to the world. Now is the time – Church – to reveal that light. Now is the time – beloved community – to be the change we need to see in the world. Now is the time – incarnate body of the Living God – to put our bodies into action. It is not enough to say a prayer – that's a start, but it is not enough. Pick up the phone and call your congressman, call your senators, call the national switchboard, call the White House. Make your values known. I don't believe any of you support this brutality or what has been left in its wake. Rise up.

There is a wonderful carol that had its genesis in the slave communities of the South in the United States. Every line of the carol is followed by the refrain, "Rise up, shepherd, and follow!" As disciples in the modern of the One who came as light to the world it is time to Rise up, and Follow!

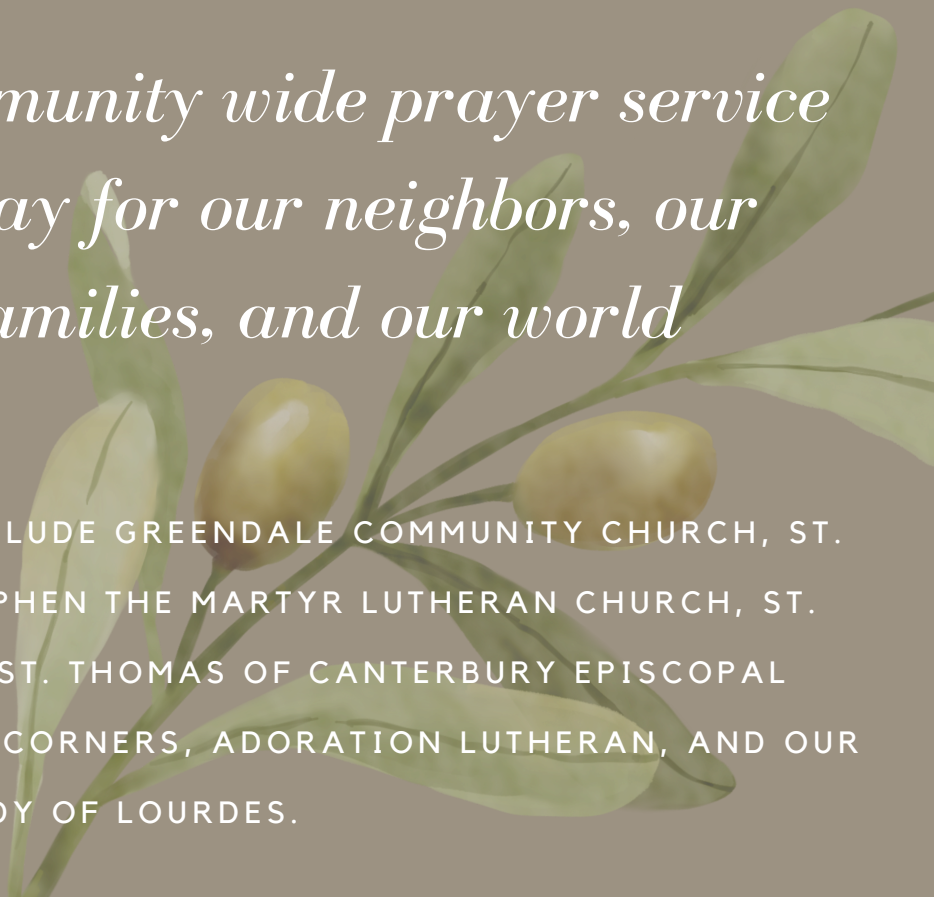

Rest ✨ & Holy Leisure

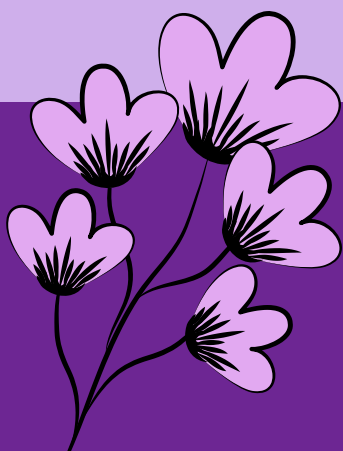

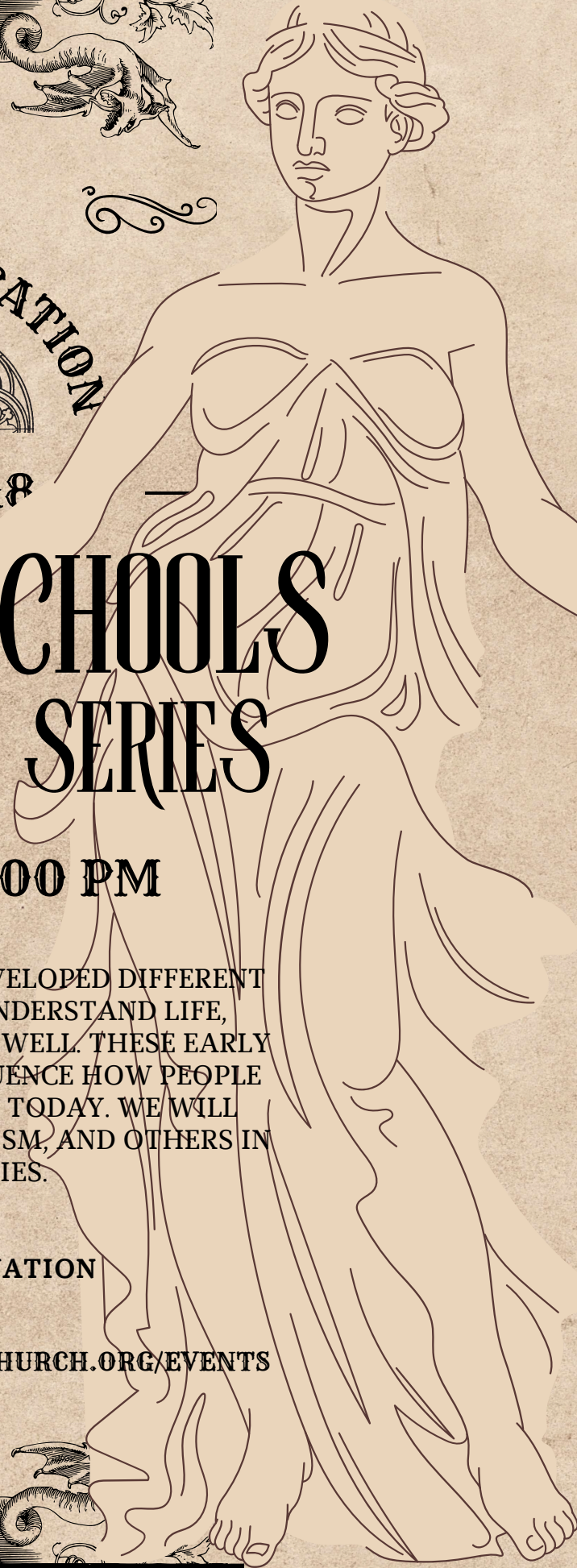
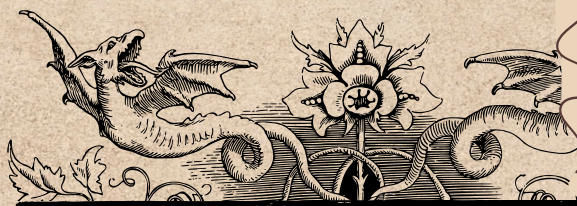
ANCIENT SCHOOLS OF THOUGHT SERIES

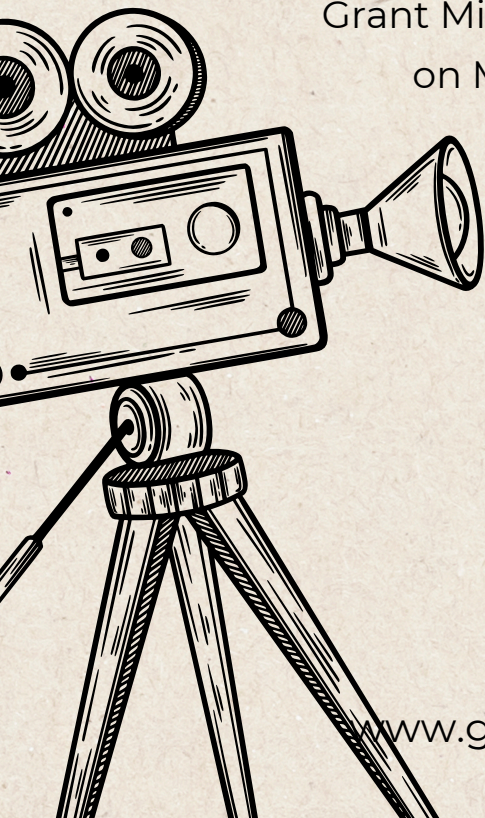
