



Last night, I was working with the Confirmation Class, and we were discussing the Epistles of Paul from the Christian Scriptures. Through a series of exercises and learning centers, the class became familiar with the major themes that are evident in Paul's writings.

At one of the centers, the particular excerpt from Corinthians read, "For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another." As they talked about what it meant to be one body, and the many parts that make up a body, they were given an exercise. An inflated balloon was placed among them. They had to keep it in the air, hitting the balloon with any part of their bodies. However, no person could go twice in a row, and they had to keep it in the air for 37 hits (don't ask me where I pulled that number from, I have no idea). The group learned that it was easier to control the balloon if it was tapped gently, rather than hit hard. And they also learned that there was a better chance of it staying in the air if they remained calm and checked in with each other as to who was going to tap it next.

When we talked about this as a larger group, we discussed how the church works. The church (sometimes called the body of Christ) is composed of many parts – its individual members, its committees, its staff people – and all have different functions, but we are all working together as the body of Christ to serve others and to work (together) toward a vision in which everyone has enough, and everyone is whole. Shalom.

We also talked about the conscious decisions that we make on a daily basis. We make so many! Each one should be bringing us closer to the fulfillment of that vision.

When we finished our evening together, one of the Confirmands led us in prayer. In her prayer, one of the things she said is, "Thank you for giving us hope." Every step we take toward fulfilling God's vision is Hope for the world.

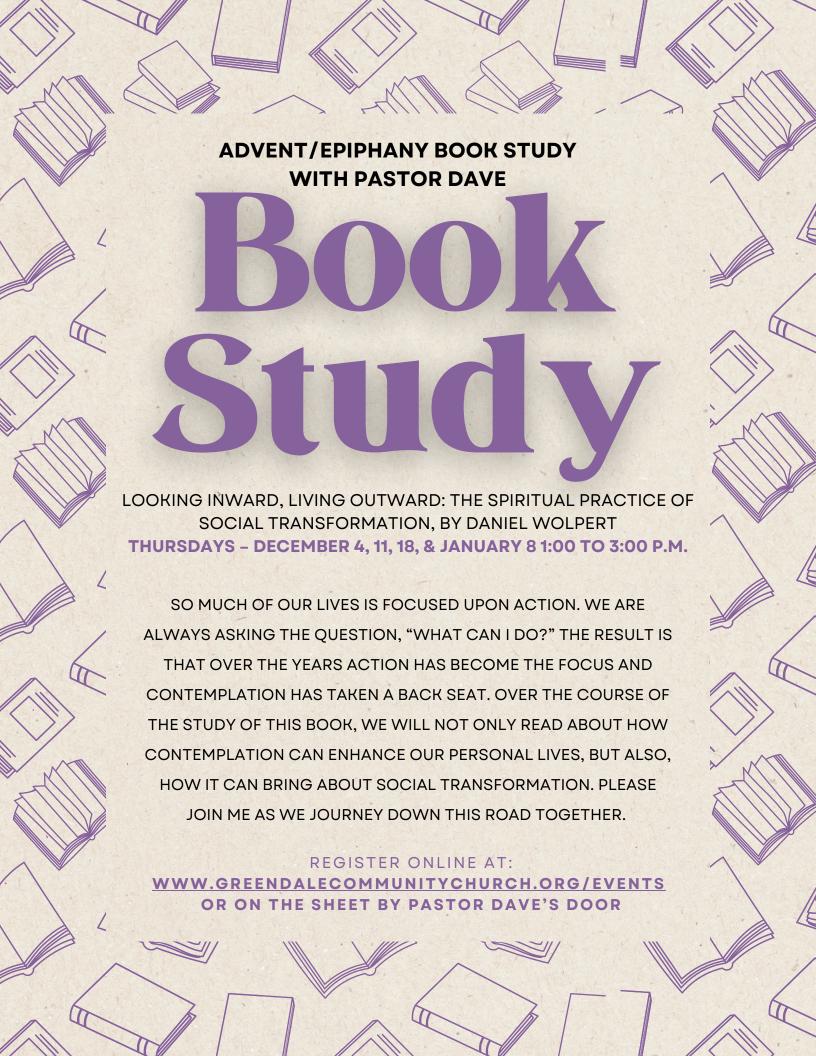
